HSC Launches New Cruising Fleet

Have your heard? This year, the Hunterdon Sailing Club is ready to appeal to a new segment of the sailing community. With an eye toward attracting and retaining new members, the executive committee voted in January to form a new Cruising Fleet and add a cruising level of membership. HSC member Kevin Pearce was installed as the Cruising Fleet Captain and will lead the club's exciting new venture.

Through the Cruising Fleet, the HSC hopes to develop a new club outlet for skippers who wish to sail in a relaxed, noncompetitive atmosphere. The goals of the new fleet will be to encourage recreation among the members, foster a feeling of good will and friendship, promote safe boating, and further the art and science of sailing. The fleet will form a community of sailors who have varied boats, skills, and backgrounds, but who share in the realization that, "There is nothing ... half so much worth doing as simply messing about in boats."

The HSC asked Cruising Fleet Captain Kevin Pearce a few questions about things to come for The Cruising Fleet ...

HSC: What are your immediate plans for the new Cruising Fleet, Kevin?

Kevin: For our first season, the Cruising Fleet plans to participate in two major events at Spruce Run Reservoir. The first event will be the Summer Sailstice 2006, which will be held on June 17th. The second major event that the Cruising Fleet will participate in is The 3rd Annual Spruce Run Trailer Sailor Flotilla on July 22nd.

HSC: How will people be informed about these and other Cruising Fleet events?

Kevin: We'll keep members updated through future editions of the Focsle and will promote the fleet activities through press releases in area newspapers. In addition, we'll spread the word throughout the season where cruisers will likely gather on an informal basis. I'm looking at activities such as mast raising parties, photo shoots of each other's boats under sail, picnics on Goose Island, etc.

HSC: How do you envision the Cruising Fleet fitting in with the normal Wednesday and Sunday HSC racing activities?

Kevin: When the HSC racing members meet to compete on Wednesdays and Sundays, cruising members have the perfect opportunity to offer a non-competitive social sailing alternatives to HSC members who don't want to race or who aren't ready to enter racing yet. HSC: Kevin, would you explain the difference between the Open Fleet and the Cruising Fleet?

Kevin: The Open Fleet is for skippers who want to compete in HSC races in sailboats other than a Jet-14, Force 5, Albacore, Flying Scot, Day Sailer, Sunfish, or Laser, using the Portsmouth Handicapping system. The Cruising Fleet is for skippers in any type of boat who simply don't want to race, but who want to participate in club activities and enjoy the social aspects and camaraderie of sailing.

HSC: Thanks, Captain Kevin Pearce, for the insights on the new HSC Cruising Fleet!

The HSC application for membership has been revised so that new and renewing members can now choose between Racing or Cruising Memberships. Both memberships are open to all persons, regardless of boat ownership, who are at least eighteen years of age and who are allowed the use of NJ State Parks. Both Racing and Cruising members will be eligible to vote on club business.

Now, all we need are some Cruising Members! In an attempt to reach out and attract new members, the HSC plans to mail a brochure to all Spruce Run slip holders this spring. You can help, too, by encouraging prospective members that you might know to contact the Membership Coordinator Stacey Bachenheimer.

Sunfish Fleet News

It's that time of year to think about rolling out your Sunfish and begin improvements and repairs that you noted as needed last season. Some items to take a look at would be all lines that have chafe points (halyard, mainsheets, cunningham, outhaul, sail ties hmmm are there any that DON'T have chafe points?) and determine if new line may be needed. Also, take a look at the hardware, make sure the blocks still run free, the sail clips are sound and the rudder and centerboard are still fair and true. Check your hiking strap will hold that weight you put on since last summer (only kidding!) Consider wetsanding the hull. Check all your gear too, gloves, smocks, sunglasses and make sure all this stuff is in one place so when the lake thaws you are ready to get out there and start sailing!

This year we will be using a new astrological, alphabetical, reverse-inverse order of winning last year to assign race committee duty so if you have any dates to avoid please let me know so I can make sure to schedule you on those days. (gotcha!)

Laser Fleet News

Proposed 2006 HSC Budget

The following is a short summary of the proposed 2006 Hunterdon Sailing Club budget for approval at the next Annual meeting.

Membership: 90 members -- annual dues \$85 with a \$15 late fee (same as last year). The final membership last year was 101. For 2006, the budget assumes HSC will retain most of its current members and provide comparable training programs to draw new members. This year HSC will offer a NEW cruising membership (this will be explained at the annual meeting).

Training: 55 Juniors and Adults enroll in HSC programs --fees same as last year. Over the last few years, HSC trained around 60 students each year. HSC anticipates another very good training year.

Operating Expense Budgets: Budgeted Operating Expenses for most line items are in line with the budget or actual expenses in 2005. The budget was increased in the following areas:

- Handbook, Focsle, Recruiting, Web -- 2005 budget with allowance for postage increases.
- Awards/Club Social Events Little Brown Jug is now HSC supported. The budget was increased to include Cruising events. In 2006, HSC will purchase burgees for sale to club members at cost. The anticipated costs are included in this line item. Offsetting receipts are in the Misc/Burgee line item.
- Insurance Our agent recommended a Regatta rider on our liability policy to cover the sponsored racing events. Although this is still under review, the expected premium has been included in the budget.

Operating surplus from 2005 will be used to cover some of the expense increases in 2006.

Capital Expenses: Capital projects are planned to improve the boats, facilities and loaner boat storage. The individual line items are outlined in the budget. HSC has ample financial resources for the proposed projects.

The proposed 2006 budget will be reviewed at the Annual Meeting. The Rear Commodore and I will be available to answer any questions.
