NJ Boat Operators' Certificate

Speaking of improvement, since 2006 the State of New Jersey has required motor boat operators to pass a test in order drive a power boat of any kind. Every active HSC club member should endeavor to get this certificate this year. As of June 1, 2009 even the old timers like me who have been grandfathered for the past few years, will need to pass the test. Charlie Engler is working with the Regional Power Squadron to arrange a motor boat operator's safety course for HSC members during the Winter. We will have more information for you soon (see p. 2)

HSC PLANS TO OFFER A BOATING SAFETY COURSE, INCLUDING THE OPPORTUNITY TO RECEIVE A NJ SAFE BOATING CERTIFICATE

We have contacted Captain Anthony Pisano of the Lackawanna Power Squadron, who has agreed to present the program, tentatively scheduled for late March, hopefully at the stone house at Spruce Run. The course will be on a Saturday from 9 to 3, plus that Sunday morning from 9 to noon. HSC would need at least ten students, and Captain Pisano can accept up to 50. A preliminary survey showed great interest in HSC members.

The course is designed for all boaters, power and sail. As boating is often a family activity, all members in a family are encouraged to attend as a group. Subjects include: boat handling under normal conditions; adverse conditions and emergencies; types of boats and boating terminology; required and recommended equipment; boating regulations and navigation rules; lines and knots; aids to navigation; marine radiotelephone usage; trailer boating; personal water craft. The student manual will serve as a reference book in basic boating long after the course work is completed.

The course meets the standards of the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators, and features a proctored examination as required by the State of New Jersey and many insurance companies.

The enthusiastic and experienced instructors are members of the Lackawanna Sail & Power Squadron (www.lackawanna.org), a unit of the United States Power Squadrons (www.usps.org) in which boating education is a traditional public service. Since 1914 local squadrons such as Lackawanna have presented courses to anyone who wished to attend – to date more than 3 million people nationwide.
