It is also recommended that you make a second photocopy that we can keep in folder aboard the *See Which Won*.

You do not need these items when operating a sailing boat unless you use an auxiliary outboard ... which might also earn you a protest on the starting line. The State Park Police are also planning to check boat and trailer registrations for boats kept at Spruce Run over the Summer. Make sure all your registrations are up to date before you park for the season.

### 35 GRADUATED AT THE HSC/LSPS SAFE BOATING COURSE

On March 21 and 22, 35 attended the HSC Safe Boating Course, presented by the Lackawanna Sail and Power Squadron at the "Stone House" at Spruce Run. The presentation on Saturday covered ALL the basics of boating, and the requirement in New Jersey that anyone operating a powered vessel must have a BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE, or be subject to severe penalties. On Sunday, following a thorough review, the actual test was given, and all 35 passed the test, making them eligible to operate the HSC RC boat and outboard safety skiffs. The LSPS instructors, headed by Capt. Anthony Pisano, were very qualified and made a very professional presentation of the wide ranging subject matter. Our new Spruce Run Superintendant Jenny Felton and her staff were most hospitable and cooperative in enabling HSC use of the Stone House. Charlie.

# **Spruce Run Disaster**

<u>Dam break at Spruce Run threatens</u> <u>HSC sailing season.</u>

The town of Clinton had a near disaster, as the smaller, south dam of Spruce Run Reservoir collapsed. The apparent cause of the collapse was a vast construction project on the opposite shore. The project, the improvement of an older home on Panorama Drive included sizeable



additions to the home, the rebuilding of a deck and the attempted construction of a huge sailboat, canoe and kayak storage facility near the water's edge plus a long dock with a Tiki bar at the end. The entire project was lost in a mud slide, triggered by the overcrowding on the deck during a Jet 14 party and the weight of a vintage Buick in the garage. The slide created a minor tsunami that moved rapidly towards the dam and undermined the footings.

Publicity Chairperson for the Hunterdon Sailing Club, Anne Freeman, interviewed many people to get reactions to the collapse and drainage of the recreational body of water above the dam. The owner of the property was unavailable for comment. However, the Park Superintendant, Jenny Felton said that her office was deluged with requests for refunds for boat storage space and the sailing club's Membership Coordinator, Stacey Bachenheimer reported similar requests for cancellation of club memberships. Flying Scot fleet captain David Stockwell said that it was just another challenge for the scheduling of the Challenge of the Lakes competition. HSC's Commodore Gordon Sell discounted these issues as a simple public relations problem that could be resolved by producing a new flyer.

Senior club member Ramon Rosswaag commented that the current appearance of the lake reminded him of the days when he used to visit the area in 1964. Kayak enthusiast Sean Meszkat bemoaned the missed chance to roar down the river through Clinton, calling it a once in a lifetime opportunity. Ellen Greenhorn, the scientist in the club, speculated that there may have been too many Bertoccis on the deck.



The "Friends of Spruce Run" of course find themselves without an important friend, and have started a political effort to ensure that New Jersey's congressional delegation gets an earmark in the next economic recovery bill for dam repair. HSC Treasurer, Mike Wheeler has made an appeal for a "bail-in" to refill the lake as soon as possible.

Ever the optimist, VC Rich Baumann, ably assisted by Ellen and Handbook Editor Kim Gold plan to publish a handbook covering HSC's 2009 sailing activities in mid-April.
